Old Business

- Minutes from October 13, 2021 approved- Tim Jeffrey motioned to approve minutes as written, Kim second the motion, all in favor of motion.

New Business

CTE-PCCAPS

- Lyndsay Huntsman, CTE director, spoke to committee regarding CTE offerings
- 9 different career clusters
- program starts in 7th grade
- 7 pathways within clusters
- New course offering-Intro to Behavioral Health, Psychology, Sociology
- Currently 80 students enrolled
- Introducing Construction Management-next semester, hands on activities with local builders
- Computer Science-begins with coding in grades K=9 lessons, grades 1-5=18 lessons, grade 6=DLI begins, grade 7-12=several options/lessons
- New offerings in 2022-2023 for grades 7-9
- PCHS and PCCAPS will offer more choices within the programs
- CNA course-complete requirements and become certified
- Many students can complete certain programs and leave with certifications
- Concurrent enrollment increased courses can be transferred to colleges for credit
- \$35 one-time fee to start the process
- All courses begin in the Fall
- High pass rate
- Adrienne Wooley, Project Coordinator/PCCAPS spoke to committee regarding different electives for grades 11 and 12

- Currently looking for projects within our community for students to work on
- All are project based learning experiences
- Current project is *Moving Windmills Project, the William Kamkwamba story* – first European project
- Grades 11 and 12 can have internships in different careers to get exposure and experience
- Students get work releases if they have an outside job that pays, can get credit for it
- There is no prerequisite for students to enter PCCAPS
- Currently this is our largest enrollment we've ever had

PreACT

- Results of finally came in
- No significant growth shown
- Teachers are utilizing data to improve
- Departments will meet to analyze data

SCC Training

- Each school runs their SCC differently but all follow the Rule of Order and Procedure
- Suggestion to try to have diversity within committee-a representative
- Our SCC is on top of the needs of the school and it's processes
- Suggestion to create different task forces and meet with teachers to get an idea of their needs
- Thoughts to hire more aides with SCC money, use money for more school specific things
- Trustlands land value has increased thus there is more money available
- The amount of money for schools is based on the number of students per school

Accreditation

- TMJH will be accredited this coming year
- We are looking for 10-15 parents from SCC, PTO to be on our Advisory committee
- Would only meet 2x's

Bond

- Teachers were excited that it passed
- Status of TMJH building has not been decided yet

Grades INC/D,F

- We decided to give students receiving a INC or D, F grades, 2 weeks to complete their assignments
- It worked, many students were able to improve
- Mixed feelings about this process, will reexamine
