COMMUNITY AND DISTRICT

Founded May 17, 1915, the Park City School District is a public school district nestled in the mountains of the year-round resort town of Park City, Utah. The district's mission is to inspire and support all students equitably to achieve their academic and social potential. Our district consists of four elementary schools (grades PreK-5), one middle school (grades 6-7), one junior high (grades 8-9), one high school (grades 10-12) and one integrated alternative program (grades 9-12). Nearly 4,500 students attend Park City schools, including 19% Latinx, 13% English Language Learners, 9% with disabilities, and 16% on free or reduced lunch. Our average class size is 22 with a 15:1 student-teacher ratio. Park City School District has an overall 93% Graduation Rate.

CURRICULUM AND COURSE OFFERINGS

Park City High School's academic school year consists of four quarters. Eight class periods are available in a block schedule, where students take four 90-minute class periods each day, alternating daily. We offer full-year and semester-long courses. We share many of our high school classes with Treasure Mountain Junior High, where our district's 9th graders attend.

Dual Language Immersion (DLI):

Our district offers French and Spanish Dual Language Immersion from elementary through high school. At the high school, the DLI Bridge program consists of 3000-level college courses that award students 6 to 9 college credits each.

Honors Courses:

Secondary Math 1, Secondary Math 2, Secondary Math 3, French 4, Spanish 4. Our honors courses are open enrollment.

Concurrent Enrollment Courses:

We partner with Utah Valley University, Weber State University, and Mountainland Technical College to offer students the opportunity to earn college credits through enrollment in eligible PCHS courses. These courses are open enrollment, but in order to receive college credit, students must meet the college's admissions requirements.

Advanced Placement (AP) Courses:

Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, French Language and Culture, U.S. Government and Politics, Human Geography (at the junior high), Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Physics 1 and 2, Physics C-Electricity and Magnetism, Physics C-Mechanics, Psychology, Spanish Language and Culture, Spanish Literature and Culture, Statistics, Studio Art Drawing, Studio Art 2-D Design, Studio Art 3-D Design, U.S. History, World History. Our AP courses are open enrollment.

A 24-credit Park City School District diploma is offered on a rare occasion. The difference is 1.0 Social Studies and 3.0 elective credits less than the PCHS diploma. This diploma meets state requirements.

Grading Scale and Ranking:

Grades are recorded quarterly, and GPA is computed using a traditional 4.0 scale using the following grade point values.

A = 4.0 B = 3.0 C = 2.0 D = 1.0 A- = 3.7 B- = 2.7 C- = 1.7 D- = 0.7 B+ = 3.3 C+ = 2.3 D+ = 1.3 F = 0

Grades with no GPA value: P (pass), NG (no grade), I (incomplete)

AP courses with a grade of C- or higher are weighted at +.0125 per course, per quarter, added to the cumulative GPA.

Students are ranked based on our weighted cumulative GPA.





Debate: PCHS has won more national awards in debate than any other public high school in Utah, and has been nationally recognized since 2018.

Music: Our Choir, Orchestra, Band, Jazz, and Percussion Ensembles have achieved Superior Ratings at multiple region and state festivals. Students selected to perform in UMEA All-State Bands, Orchestras, Choirs and Jazz Band. Numerous Excellent and Superior Ratings at various region and state level festivals. Ongoing national recognition through individual student and full group participation in various competitions, festivals and invitationals.

Clubs & Activities: We offer a variety of student interest clubs and National Organizations, including National Honor Society. See our website for a list. Students may apply to create a new club and must reapply annually. Clubs are student-led, but have a staff advisor.



PBIS Culture: Prepared, Compassionate, Hard-working and Safe (P.C.H.S.) are expectations that we will follow as a school to create a safe and positive school environment. Our goal is that all of our stakeholders feel connected and engaged in our school community and community at large.

COVID-19 Impact: Due to state-wide school closure, students completed the 2019-2020 school year remotely. Grading options for Quarter 4 included letter grades A through D-, P, and NG (no F grades). The 2020-2021 school year included both inperson and remote learning options, and we returned to our standard grading scale. Classes resumed to fully in-person with the 2021-2022 school year.
